Dave Kowalski, Coach Bangor John Glenn

Dave has had the good fortune to be associated with; great kids, great parents, awesome facilities, and even more important, a loving and understanding wife who allows him to pursue a passion that has brought a lifetime sport to many kids. Sharing this honor with Craig Block, the Bangor John Glenn Boys bowling program has become one of the premier programs in the state. 2 state team titles, 1 runner-up, 4 dream team members, 7 all state recipients, 6 regional titles, along with 5 conference titles speak for the programs successes. The true driving force that the program follows is stated in their team credo: "Each member of this program not only represents our school and our city, but most importantly, the great sport of Bowling. Always showing class, sportsmanship and pride always: He takes great satisfaction and pride in being a board member of the association. His contributions are many and shows tremendous commitment in all that he does. Dave was instrumental in creating the Baker scoring format, the format for post season events and the tournament ranking committee. He also chaired the legislative committee that wrote the code of ethics, set term limits, set the policy manual requirements. Dave has held several positions on the board and was instrumental in developing the bowling programs in several schools. Dave is extremely grateful to be receiving this prestigious honor and again, without the support of his wife of 26 years Cindy and son Kevin, this dream would never have come true..

Judy Jaeger, Coach Ladywood

Judy Jaeger assumed what she thought would be a temporary position as coach for the Ladywood High School bowling team when her husband, the founding coach became ill. With the encouragement of Ladywood's athletic director, Sal Malek, she remained as coach when her husband died a few months later. With Sal Malek's help she established several high school bowling tournaments, the Ladywood Holiday Tournament, the Ladywood J.V. Tournament and the Dennis Jaeger Catholic League Tournament which still continue today. During the 2003-2004 bowling season she helped Ladywood High School transition to a sport recognized by the Michigan High School Athletic Association. Ladywood has been a regional tournament host since 2004. In collaboration with Nancy and George Juszczyk from Divine Child High School and Linda Mitchell from Crestwood High School she helped establish the first Wayne County High School Bowling Championship. She has been an active member of the coaches association from its formation. Since its inception she has served as a member of the Awards Committee and in July 2006 she was elected as the Association's secretary. Judy has helped manage the Division II State Championships for the past three years. In 2006, she was honored by the Detroit Free Press by being named the Girl's High School Bowling Coach of the Year. One of greatest joys in coaching for her has been the chance to coach her daughter, Sarah and to now have her daughter come back and coach with her.

Craig has been the head boys' coach and coordinator of the Bay City John Glenn High School bowling program for twelve of the thirteen years bowling has existed at John Glenn. Since the 2003 - 2004 season, his boys' bowling teams and players have achieved numerous championships and awards, they include: 21 All-Conference players, 7 All-State members, 5 All-State Academic members, 4 Detroit Free Press Dream Team members, 5 Tri-City Conference championships, 5 MHSAA Regional championships, 2004 Class B State Champion runner-up, 2005 Class B State Champion, and 2010 Division 2 State Champion. Being able to share the 2005 state championship with his oldest sons Nathan and Trevor, then sharing the 2010 championship with his youngest son, Hayden, are his proudest moments. Craig is thankful to the Bangor Township athletic department for all of its support from the very first day of practice twelve years ago, to his friend and co-coach, Dave Kowalski, to all of the parents and dedicated athlete, and especially to his caring and supportive wife Sheri.
