
Rudy Godefroidt, Educator

Rudy has been involved with the sport for close to 50 years. He was a youth bowler in the Detroit area and participated in the Coca Teen Masters during the sixties. Having bowled in men's leagues since 1973 and continues to bowl in two leagues weekly. Rudy has a high game of 299 and a high series of 798. He is a retired school administrator but is currently coordinating student teachers for Central Michigan University. Rudy taught school for thirteen years then moved to the administration for the Breckenridge Community Schools for twenty two years. From there he moved to Hemlock system and served as the high school principal for eight years then went on to serve as their superintendent for five years. Rudy has been very active with the Michigan High School Athletic Association and was on the ground floor in working with Randy Allen and the Bowling Proprietors in getting the sport of Bowling recognized as a MHSAA high school sport. He has served on the MHSAA bowling committee since it's inception and was also a member of the MHSAA Representative Council until he retired at the end of August, 2010. Rudy has managed a MHSAA regional tournament every year with the exception of one and has attended every state finals.

Keith Krueger, Hemlock Boys Coach

Keith Krueger is the head coach for the Hemlock boys bowling team. He began his coaching career at Nouvel Catholic High School and continued his coaching when he moved to Hemlock where coached for nine years. Keith has been the conference coordinator for the Tri-Valley west conference. He has been a part of the coaches association since it's inception, a regional director for four years. Serving on various committees especially the all state committee and for the past two years served as the association vice president. He teaches math and science at school (in his spare time). While coaching at Hemlock he has taken his teams to the state finals in all but three years producing a record of 73-20 with two conference titles and one regional title. Keith takes great pride in turning an individual that has never bowled into a serious competitor shooting honor scores by the time they graduate. In his own right, Keith is an accomplished bowler in his own right maintaining a 220 plus average and recording ten three hundred games and two eight hundred series.

Robert Lomonaco Proprietor & Coach

Robert (Bobby) Lomonaco was instrumental in developing bowling as a club sport in West Michigan in the late 90's and helped to establish the 30 team Grand Rapids Bowling Conference. He helped set up the conference rules and helped the Ottawa-Kent conference do the same. After the MHSAA accepted bowling as a sport, Bobby, as owner of Park Center Lanes provided a home for 2 to 4 teams each season. He has served as regional tournament manager since 2008 and in 2011, hosted a regional tournament in his center as well as serving as a member of the MHSAA's Bowling committee. Bobby has been involved as a coach for over 13 years beginning at East Kentwood and currently at Grand Rapids Catholic Central.

Sue Hutchings Proprietor & Coach

Sue Hutchings started her career in 1989 with her first coaching class and Certification. Her philosophy remains the same after 22 years, "keep the ball on the lanes, knock down pins and have fun. She is co-owner of Marshall Lanes and has been the Marshall HS bowling coach since 1998 as well as being one of the founding members of the Southwest Eight Conference and the Michigan High School Bowling Coaches Association. She has earned the USBC Bronze certification, the Dick Ritger Level III and has logged 18 hours with the MHSAA CAP program. In 2005 Sue was named Detroit Free Press Girls Bowling Coach of the year. Having worked at both regional and state level finals, serving four times on the MHSAA Tournament Rules Committee and qualifying teams and or individuals to the state finals is not necessarily measured as successful. Success is the satisfaction received in helping others enjoy the sport to the best of their ability.

Sue coaches the Coldwater Girls High School Bowling team. She has worked very hard for many years to advance the cause of High School Bowling.
