Ann Roznowski, Coach

Ann has coached the Bay City John Glenn Girls Team for the last 10 seasons, with a regular season record of 69 Wins against 1 Loss. During that time the girls have accumulated 9 Conference Championships, 7 State Team Regional Championships, and made 7 appearances in the State Championship Elimination Round resulting in 1 State Girls Team Championship and 5 State Girls Team Runner-Up Awards. Ann has been recognized by her peers as the 2007 MHSIBCA Girls Coach of the Year, 2009 John Glenn Girls Coach of the Season, 2011 Bay City Times Winter Sports Dream Team Girls Coach of the Year, 2011 John Glenn Coach of the Season, and the 2011 Michigan High School Coaches Association Coach of the Year. She is a Board Member of the Bay Area United States Bowling Congress Bowling Association, and a Committee Member of the Bay Area USBC Youth Board.

“In my 10 years of coaching, various JGHS individual girls and teams hold the conference records for high 2 game series, high game, high Baker 2 game series, high Baker game, high individual 2 game series and high individual game.
