#### Ann Roznowski, Coach

Ann has coached the Bay City John Glenn Girls Team for the last 10 seasons, with a regular season record of 69 Wins against I Loss. During that time the girls have accumulated 9 Conference Championships, 7 State Team Regional Championships, and made 7 appearances in the State Championship Elimination Round resulting in I State Girls Team Championship and 5 State Girls Team Runner-Up Awards. Ann has been recognized by her peers as the 2007 MHSIBCA Girls Coach of the Year, 2009 John Glenn Girls Coach of the Season, 2011 Bay City Times Winter Sports Dream Team Girls Coach of the Year, 2011 John Glenn Coach of the Season, and the 2011 Michigan High School Coaches Association Coach of the Year. She is a Board Member of the Bay Area United States Bowling Congress Bowling Association, and a Committee Member of the Bay Area USBC Youth Board. "In my 10 years of coaching, various JGHS individual girls and teams hold the conference records for high 2 game series, high game, high Baker 2 game series, high Baker game, high individual 2 game series and high individual game. Jim has been the head varsity coach with Wyoming/Kellogsville since the 2002 season with an outstanding assistant coach in Dan Desrosiers. We have worked with both the boys and girls program over that time. The girls team has won 8 consecutive conference titles posting an 83-1 record (111-8 since 2002). The girls program has qualified for the State Finals 9 consecutive years, making the match play round the last 7 years, winning I State Runner-Up, and 3 State Championship Titles. Ten Kelloggsville girls have been elected to First Team All-State, several being on the team all four years, and two girls have been selected for the Senior Dream Team. At the same time the Boys Team also found success on the lanes with a conference record with 80 wins over 39 losses. During that time they have qualified four times for State Finals and advanced to the quarter finals one year. The Boys Team has had 3 first team All-State members with one being named Mr. Bowler. I want a special thanks to Bruce Foster my AD, and Mindy Wert at Kelloggsville for all the support they have given me over the year.
